Water Officials Encourage Residents to Turn Off All Sprinkler Systems This Week

Heavy rains in Long Beach means there is no need for outdoor irrigation until next week at the earliest

LONG BEACH, CA – Rain clouds have come to the Long Beach area and should drop significant amounts of rain today and possibly more throughout the remainder of the week.

A considerable amount of rain has already fallen in the City of Long Beach, with additional rainfall forecast for later this week. Therefore, the Long Beach Board of Water Commissioners is asking all Long Beach Water Customers to turn off all of their outdoor irrigation systems until at least next week.

“It just makes sense,” said Paul Blanco, President of the Long Beach Board of Water Commissioners. “With all the rain we are getting, there is no need to water your plants or lawns for the rest of the week,” continued Blanco.
